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PSA: New Blood Donation Guidelines Reinstate Eligibility for Potential Donors

(**Hyannis, MA – May 8, 2023**) – Following recently updated guidelines by the Food and Drug Administration, Cape Cod Healthcare will reinstate eligibility for donors who were previously deferred from blood donation because of travel or residence in the United Kingdom, France or Ireland.

The deferral was connected to a risk of transmitting the variant Creutzfeldt-Jakob Disease (vCJD, also known as mad cow disease) to blood transfusion recipients. The FDA has concluded this is no longer a geographic risk to donors who have lived in the UK and other European countries.

Previous FDA guidance recommended indefinite deferral for people who spent time in the UK from 1980 to 1996 or France and Ireland from 1980 to 2001, or people who received a blood transfusion in the UK, France or Ireland from 1980 to the present.

In light of the new guidance change, Jonathan Decoste, Senior Blood Recruiter at Cape Cod Healthcare, encourages those who are newly eligible to give blood donation a try.

"We encourage anyone who may have been previously deferred from donating having lived, worked, studied or stationed in the military during this time frame to try again," says Decoste.

Donors will still see questions on the health questionnaire regarding travel overseas, but this will no longer result in a deferral related to vCJD.
